## **Sacrament of Baptism**

## **First Communion & Confirmation Program**

Parents are asked to contact the office for information. Our programs begin in the fall (September or October) and end with the reception of the sacraments. Registration dates are announced in the bulletin, on our website, social media, and from the pulpit.

## **Sacrament of Matrimony**

Couples contemplating marriage at St. Jude's parish are required to make contact with the parish office and review the marriage package before an interview with the priest. Diocesan regulation demands that marriages are booked one year in advance minimum.

#### **III Sunday in Ordinary Time** "The Spirit of God is upon me".

Two weeks ago, we heard about the baptism of Jesus. That day Jesus was anointed by the Holy Spirit in the Jordan River, after he was baptized by John, and the voice of the Father was heard pointing him out as his beloved Son. Since then, Jesus is the Christ, that is, the Anointed One. Every anointed one has a mission, and that of Jesus Christ is described by the prophet Isaiah saying: "He has anointed me to bring good news to the poor, to release the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour."

The Father, our creator who gave rhythm to this world, has sent Jesus with the strength of his Holy Spirit, to free us from the slavery of sin, to cure us from our blindness of selfishness, to free us from the oppression of death, to unite us to him and to make us partakers of his eternal life.

This is the good news my brothers and sister, that Jesus has come to free us from the bonds of sins and to invite us to listen to his word. Words that have eternal life.

#### **III Domenica Del Tempo Ordinario** "Lo Spirito di Dio è sopra di me".

Due settimane fa, abbiamo sentito parlare del battesimo di Gesù. Quel giorno Gesù fu unto dallo Spirito Santo nel fiume Giordano, dopo essere stato battezzato da Giovanni, e la voce del Padre fu udita indicarlo come il suo amato Figlio. Da allora, Gesù è il Cristo, cioè l'Unto. Ogni unto ha una missione, e quella di Gesù Cristo è descritta dal profeta Isaia dicendo: "Mi ha unto per portare un lieto messaggio ai poveri, per liberare i prigionieri e il recupero della vista ai ciechi, per rimettere in libertà gli oppressi e proclamare l'anno di grazia del Signore".

#### **III Domingo Del Tiempo Ordinario** "El Espíritu de Dios está sobre mí".

Hace dos semanas, hemos escuchado hablar del bautismo de Jesús. Ese día Jesús fue ungido por el Espíritu Santo en el río Jordán, después de haber sido bautizado por Juan, y se escuchó la voz del Padre que lo señalaba como su Hijo amado. Desde entonces, Jesús es el Cristo, es decir, el Ungido. Todo ungido tiene una misión, y la de Jesucristo es descrita por el profeta Isaías diciendo: "Me ha ungido para dar la Buena Nueva a los pobres, para dar la libertad a los cautivos y la vista a los ciegos, para dar la libertad a los oprimidos y para proclamar el año de gracia del Señor".



Fr Josue does not send e-mails asking people to respond or asking for donations.

#### **Mass Intentions**

Mass intentions to be announced on weekend masses and the following week, must be requested by Wednesday of each week. We cannot change dates for masses previous sly requested. Each mass intention can include up to two individual names with the same last name. Thank you for your understanding and your cooperation.

## **Pastoral Reference Requests**

In order for the pastor to be able to recommend you, he needs to know you. This is only possible if he has personal knowledge of your faith practice and involvement in the parish; not your relatives, but yourself, as this is a personal recommendation.

- The following are required at St. Jude's:
- Be (yourself, not your parents or grandparents) a registered member of the parish using offertory envelopes for at least one year.
- Be in the parish for participation in Sun day/Saturday mass for at least one year prior to approaching the pastor.
- Applicant must be actively involved in a parish ministry or volunteer activity for a least one year.
- Please ensure that you meet these requirements before making your request.

It is important for you to know that to be hired to teach in any Catholic School Board in Ontario as part of your application for employment you must provide a letter of recommendation from your Pastor.
