VIII Sunday in Ordinary Time My brothers and sisters today the Word of God teaches us about wisdom in the way we speak and act. The first reading from the Book of Sirach touches about prudence in speech, just as the holy gospel according to Saint Luke does.

These readings speak to us about the great responsibility we must have for what we say and that our mouth is our own judge. The apostle James in his letter tells us that, just as a small rudder guides a huge boat, in the same way our small tongue can do much good or much harm, because it is through it that we ordinarily conduct our life (cf. James 3:4-5).

The first reading says: "The fruit reveals the growth of the tree, so the word reveals the heart of the person" (Sir 27:6).

In the Gospel Jesus tells us: "A good man says good things because good is in his heart. and an evil man savs evil because evil is in his heart. For out of the heart his mouth speaks" (Lk 7:45).

My brothers and sisters, as we reflect on our words, it is good once again to recall that one purpose of our words is to praise God.

VIII Domenica del Tempo Ordinario

L'apostolo Giacomo nella sua lettera ci dice che, proprio come un piccolo timone guida una grande barca, allo stesso modo la nostra piccola lingua può fare molto bene o molto male, perché è attraverso di essa che conduciamo ordinariamente la nostra vita (cfr. Giacomo 3:4-5).

La prima lettura dice: "Il frutto rivela la crescita dell'albero, così la parola rivela il cuore dell'uomo" (Sir 27:6).

Nel Vangelo Gesù ci dice: "L'uomo buono dice cose buone perché nel suo cuore c'è del bene, e l'uomo cattivo dice cose cattive perché nel suo cuore c'è del male. Perché dal cuore parla la sua bocca" (Lc 7:45). Fratelli e sorelle, mentre riflettiamo sulle nostre parole, è bene ricordare ancora una volta che uno degli scopi delle nostre parole è lodare Dio.

VIII Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Hermanos y hermanas, hoy la Palabra de Dios nos enseña sobre la sabiduría en el modo de hablar y de actuar. La primera lectura del Sirácida habla de la prudencia en el hablar, como lo hace el santo evangelio según san Lucas.

El apóstol Santiago en su carta nos dice que, así como un pequeño timón guía una gran barca, así también nuestra pequeña lengua puede hacer mucho bien o mucho mal, porque es a través de ella que ordinariamente conducimos nuestra vida (cf. Santiago 3,4-5).

La primera lectura dice: «El fruto revela el crecimiento del árbol, así la palabra revela el corazón del hombre» (Eclo 27,6).

En el Evangelio Jesús nos dice: «El hombre bueno habla el bien porque tiene el bien en su corazón; el hombre malo habla el mal porque tiene el mal en su corazón. Porque del corazón habla la boca» (Lc 7,45).

Hermanos y hermanas, al reflexionar sobre nuestras palabras, es bueno recordar una vez más que uno de los propósitos de nuestras palabras es alabar a Dios.

Pastoral Reference Requests

In order for the pastor to be able to recommend you, he needs to know you. This is only possible if he has personal knowledge of your faith practice and involvement in the parish; not your relatives, but yourself, as this is a personal recommendation.

The following are required at St. Jude's:

- Be (yourself, not your parents or grandparents) a registered member of the parish using offertory envelopes for at least one year.
- Be in the parish for participation in Sun day/Saturday mass for at least one year prior to approaching the pastor.
- Applicant must be actively involved in a parish ministry or volunteer activity for a least one year.
- Please ensure that you meet these requirements before making your request.

It is important for you to know that to be hired to teach in any Catholic School Board in Ontario as part of your application for employment you must provide a letter of recommendation from your Pastor.
