



XXVI Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel, Jesus proposes the parable of the poor Lazarus and the rich man, in which the rich man dressed in purple and fine fabrics, eating splendidly every day; while poor Lazarus lay at the door of the rich man's house, covered with sores and longing to eat the crumbs left over from his table; but the rich never bothered to help the poor.

The name of Lazarus has a beautiful meaning, it means: "The one helped by God". Thus, happed with that poor man whom no one helped, but he found his support in the Lord to survive.

The consequence in the parable was that when the poor man died, he was taken to Abraham's bosom, as the Jews called the place of salvation; but when the rich man died, he was only buried. Jesus describes a dialogue that the rich man has with Abraham, from hades the place of torment where he was, to the place of salvation where Lazarus was with Abraham. The rich man begged that Lazarus be sent to cool his tongue with the tip of his wet finger, but Abraham tells him that one cannot cross from one side to the other, because of the impassable abyss between the two places. As we well know, heaven is conquered here and now, and with death our opportunities to make merits to win a place with the Lord end. For this reason, it is here and now when we can do something for the life to come. Then, when you pass away: "May the Angels lead you into paradise: may the martyrs receive you at your coming, and lead you into the holy city, Jerusalem. May the choir of Angels receive you, and with Lazarus, who once was poor, may you have everlasting rest".

XXVI Domenica del Tempo Ordinario

Nel Vangelo di oggi, Gesù propone la parabola del povero Lazzaro e del ricco, in cui il ricco vestiva di porpora e di stoffe pregiate, mangiando splendidamente ogni giorno; mentre il povero Lazzaro giaceva alla porta della casa del ricco, coperto di piaghe e desideroso di mangiare le briciole rimaste dalla sua tavola; ma il ricco non si preoccupava mai di aiutare il povero.

Il nome Lazzaro ha un significato meraviglioso, significa: "Colui che è aiutato da Dio". Così accadde a quel povero che nessuno aiutò, ma che trovò nel Signore il suo sostegno per sopravvivere.

La conseguenza della parabola fu che quando il povero morì, fu portato nel seno di Abramo, come gli ebrei chiamavano il luogo della salvezza; ma quando morì il ricco, fu solo sepolto. Gesù descrive un dialogo che il ricco ha con Abramo, dall'Ade, il luogo di tormento in cui si trovava, al luogo della salvezza dove Lazzaro era con Abramo. Il ricco implorò che Lazzaro fosse mandato a rinfrescargli la lingua con la punta del dito bagnato, ma Abramo gli disse che non si può passare da una parte all'altra, a causa dell'abisso invalicabile tra i due luoghi. Come ben sappiamo, il paradiso si conquista qui e ora, e con la morte

finiscono le nostre opportunità di accumulare meriti per conquistare un posto presso il Signore. Per questo motivo, è qui e ora che possiamo fare qualcosa per la vita che verrà. Poi, quando morirai: "Che gli angeli ti guidino in paradiso: che i martiri ti accolgano alla tua venuta e ti introducano nella città santa, Gerusalemme. Che il coro degli angeli ti accolga e con Lazzaro, che un tempo era povero, tu possa avere il riposo eterno".

XXVI Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús propone la parábola del pobre Lázaro y el hombre rico. En ella, el hombre rico se vestía de púrpura y telas finas, comiendo espléndidamente todos los días; mientras que el pobre Lázaro yacía a la puerta de la casa del hombre rico, cubierto de llagas y deseando comer las migajas que sobraban de su mesa; pero el rico nunca se molestó en ayudar a los pobres.

El nombre de Lázaro tiene un hermoso significado: "Aquel a quien Dios avuda". Así sucedió con ese pobre hombre a quien nadie ayudó, pero que encontró apoyo en el Señor para sobrevivir. La consecuencia de la parábola fue que, cuando el pobre murió, fue llevado al seno de Abraham, como los judíos llamaban al lugar de salvación; pero cuando el rico murió, solo fue enterrado. Jesús describe un diálogo que el hombre rico mantiene con Abraham, desde el lugar de tormento donde se encontraba, hasta el lugar de salvación donde Lázaro estaba con Abraham. El hombre rico rogó que enviaran a Lázaro a refrescarle la lengua con la punta de su dedo mojado, pero Abraham le respondió que no se podía cruzar de un lado a otro debido al abismo que los separaba. Como bien sabemos, el cielo se conquista aquí y ahora, y con la muerte terminan nuestras oportunidades de hacer méritos para ganar un lugar con el Señor. Por eso, es aquí y ahora cuando podemos hacer algo por la vida venidera. Entonces, cuando fallezcas: «Que los ángeles te conduzcan al paraíso; que los mártires te reciban a tu llegada y te conduzcan a la ciudad santa, Jerusalén. Que el coro de los ángeles te reciba, y con Lázaro, que una vez fue pobre, tengas el descanso eterno».

World Day of Migrants and Refugees Sunday, October 5th, 2025

On the 111th World Day of Migrants and Refugees, the theme announced by His Holiness is "Migrants, Missionaries of Hope." In his message, Pope Leo XIV highlights the resilience of migrants and refugees who give witness to hope amidst very difficult circumstances. He reminds us that those who welcome migrants and refugees can also reflect this same hope. His messages ends with a call to entrust all those who journey, and all those accompany them to the protection of Virgin Mary, comfort of migrants.



Mass Intentions

We cannot change dates for masses previously requested. Each mass intention can include up to two individual names with the same last name. Thank you for your understanding and your co-operation.

Pastoral Reference Requests

In order for the pastor to be able to recommend you, he needs to know you. This is only possible if he has personal knowledge of your faith practice and involvement in the parish; not your relatives, but yourself, as this is a personal recommendation.

The following are required at St. Jude's:

- Be (yourself, not your parents or grandparents) a registered member of the parish using offertory envelopes for at least one year.
- Be in the parish for participation in Sun day/Saturday mass for at least one year prior to approaching the pastor.
- Applicant must be actively involved in a parish ministry or volunteer activity for a least one year. requirements before making your request.

It is important for you to know that to be hired to teach in any Catholic School Board in Ontario as part of your application for employment you must provide a recommendation letter from your Pastor.
